**Treasurer's Report:** Brian LaCour reported that, as of the end of October 2023, we had \$2,378.00 in the General Fund, \$12,620.24 in the Beautification Fund (of which \$3,461.11 is available for spending), and 148 members.

**Minutes:**The September 2023 Minutes were approved by a vote. A link to the Video recording of the meeting is posted on the Facebook link listed in the Agenda.

**Announcements**-Posted in attached Meeting Agenda with one addition: Anne Teich Requested \$400 to fund a new sign on the High School fence. After discussion, an amendment to authorize \$600 was approved. A unanimous vote approved the funds Ann acting as Committee Chair to follow up.

A second fund-raiser for Lanier/Navarro H.S. was mentioned, and recommended highly by members in the meeting: The holiday plant sale! Order form on the meeting agenda

**Art in Public Places** - Has approved a grant to artist Ernesto Hernandez, who is planning to design the art after receiving feedback from community members on color, material, and style. All in attendance had a chance to indicate preferences; one member suggested the theme "Everyone smiles in the same Language".

# IH-35 Expansion Local resistance groups asking all residents to read their websites and give comments to TxDOT and other authorities.

Brendan Wittstruck of Hyde Park NA Steering Cmte and North Central I35 Neighborhood Coalition (NCINC.org) explained reasons to appeal to TxDOT to slow the decision as presented, and reconsider EPA and other factors.

Shannon Clark, (Re-Think I-35.org) explained the Austin City Council resolution to sue TxDOT for violating planning procedures and environmental protections, needs funding. CAMPOtexas.org will decide on January 29th and needs input from residents.

Tim Bray from CouncilMember Chito Vela's office prepared a summary and is advocating for a better I-35 plan. Tim.Brayaustintexas.gov

## Land Use Code Updates -

# H.O.M.E (Home Options for Middle-Income Empowerment)

Chito Vela explained that most residential lots will all be re-zoned SF-3 to allow up to 3 dwellings on one lot if impervious cover ratios were met. He believes the benefits will be 1. more dwellings for middle income earners, 2. increased overall tax revenue to pay for infrastructure upgrades and city services 3. Increased density in neighborhoods and less sprawl that will use public transportation, sidewalks, local businesses and consume fewer resources overall. When questioned if the utility infrastructure could handle triple the demand, his answer was that, yes the facilities could handle that today, BUT, whether we approve SF-3 or not, all utilities are due for an upgrade and funds are not sufficient yet, to do that.

The other Land Use proposals in front of the Planning Commission include:

1. eliminating parking requirements for new construction

2. Allowing RV's on residential property to be used for housing all year.

We ran out of time to discuss these. Councilmember Leslie Pool's proposal and the other Council member's responses can be read here. (FYI Pool is completing her 3rd term and not running next year.)

**Little Walnut Creek Flood Remediation Update-**All is going as planned at Quail Creek Park and some road disruption to the West of Parkfield/Mearns Meadow is next.

**Redfield 34 Update-** 24/7 security provided by the City of Austin seems to be ensuring a reduction in breaches of the peace while the "Conservator" is clearing the property of the last 7 tenants and re-marketing it as low income housing. A partnership with Family Eldercare (who provides case management) was mentioned, but no concrete news.
